

Ignite Week #2 Lesson Scripture: Luke 22:31-34

Chapter Two: Prayer is Spiritual Warfare

Group questions:

Pa	ages 28 - 41
<u>Gı</u>	roup questions:
•	Have you ever been in a fight? If so, how did it end?
•	Who or what would you be willing to fight for today?
•	Whether you enjoy <u>fighting</u> or not, when it's time to fight, the outcome will be better if you are <u>prepared</u> .
•	Our enemy, <u>Satan</u> , is looking to fight us everyday.
•	Jesus explains to Peter that Satan wants to <u>fight</u> (sift him), but that He <u>prayed</u> for Peter.
•	The only <u>weapon</u> that Jesus decided to use against the attack was <u>prayer</u> .
•	Understand that Satan would not attack you if you weren't a threat .
•	What God has <u>planned</u> for you is so great that the enemy wants to stop you now and at any cost.
•	What plans are you trusting God for in the future?



- Satan had to ask for <u>permission</u> from Jesus to sift Peter.
- The enemy is not as <u>powerful</u> as he might seem. He needs to be <u>allowed</u> access to your life.
- So why would God give him <u>access</u> to your life? (Good question)
- Good parents understand that sometimes they must permit things that they do not prefer for the development of their child.
- God allows the enemy *some* access to you and not *complete* access, it is only to help you grow.
- Whenever you find yourself in a spiritual battle remember that <u>prayer</u> is still the answer to <u>defeating</u> devil.
- Jesus knew Peter's need and addressed it in <u>prayer</u>.

•	What is your current prayer request that you would like for the
	group to pray?

- Read Galatians 6:7-10
- The <u>trick</u> of the enemy is to deceive us into believing that we will not win.
- In war, such as World War I, the battle is won not always by might, but rather by which side is willing to stay in the <u>fight</u> the <u>longest</u>.
- Prayer like life is not a <u>sprint</u>. It is a <u>marathon</u>. The longer you stay focused, the closer you are to finishing well.



- Paul writes in this epistle that we should not give up because in <u>due</u> season we will reap.
- The enemy will use <u>deception</u>, temptation, or even <u>accusation</u> to defeat us; but his favorite weapon is <u>delay</u>.
- We must defeat his weapons with our own, starting with <u>trust</u> and <u>patience</u> in the Lord.
- Before any fruit is <u>reaped</u>, it will have to be planted and then given time to <u>grow</u>.

Vhat are you waiting on to reap in due season?	

- Prayer pushes <u>resources</u> and reinforcements to the <u>frontline</u> of the battle.
- Our job/role is to <u>pray</u> in season and out of season as we are trusting God to send the <u>supplies</u> in due season.



Suggested Group Activities For This Week:

- Create a "Prayer Wall" in your group where each member can add a prayer request inviting everyone to pray with them. This can be a social page or a Google group document that everyone has access to.
- Make a list of scriptures that deal with prayer in order to have a complete list for weekly reading.

- Continue to add names of friends and family members for the group to pray over.
