

Ignite Week #4 Lesson

Scripture: Luke 22:31-34 Chapter Four: The Power of Intercessory Prayer Pages: 60 -73 Group Questions:
When was the last time you underestimated someone?
How much confidence do you have in the power of prayer?
 Prayer is often seen as the last <u>resort</u> when it should actually be our first and often only response.
• Jesus is <u>all-powerful</u> . He walked on water, He healed the sick, and even the wind and water listened to Him.
• Even with all of the <u>choices</u> Jesus had to deliver Peter from Satan, He decided to use what He knew would work best prayer. Message: prayer is enough.
 If prayer was <u>enough</u> for Jesus then prayer is enough for us today.
 Prayer is similar to an all-access pass given to a guest at an event. With this pass they can gain <u>access</u> to any area of the event. With prayer, God has given us an all-access pass to what we need as well – intentional time with Him.

- While Peter was in <u>prison</u>, the church prayed for him, knowing that they could not do everything yet they could do this one thing.
- Intercessory prayer is teamwork designed to be done <u>together</u> and on the behalf of others.

- Why does it seem easier for us to pray for ourselves than for others?
- While he was in prison, Peter needed the prayers of the <u>church</u> to be added with his prayers in order for change to happen.
- What if there is someone in our life who cannot be <u>released</u> from their current situation without having us join them in prayer? How might this change the way we pray?
- Prayer is <u>powerful</u> and prayer is enough.
