•	This scripture shows us that our God is a <u>forgiving</u> God. He also <u>expects</u> us to not just forgive but also to love.
•	Due to her gratitude for being forgiven by Jesus the women in this text felt lead to anoint him with expensive oil. Rather, then feeling like a religious requirement, our prayer life out to be rooted in the same kind of relational gratitude.

 We serve a God who does not want us to <u>fall</u> but has set His grace up to catch us after the fall. We must be willing to be <u>caught</u> by Him. 	
• No matter how far or how often we <u>betray</u> our relationship with Christ, we are assured by the <u>demonstration</u> of His love for us at Calvary that there is always life after the fall.

When was the last time you thought God was upset with you?							

- In this Scripture we know that the <u>Prodigal</u> son has made a big <u>mistake</u>. The son also knows that the mistake was made and that he needs to make a change.
- Before he makes the change though, the son, like many of us, tries to fix it <u>himself</u>, which results in him being in an even <u>worse</u> place than before.
- The trick of the enemy is to make you believe that you can get yourself out of your <u>issue</u> when the real result is you're <u>digging</u> yourself in deeper.
- Once the son turns from his <u>current</u> situation and heads back to his father (repentance) his life begins to <u>change</u> for the better.
- The same is true of us that when we <u>repent</u> to our Father in prayer, life will begin to change for the better.
- When we are too <u>headstrong</u>, we make ourselves <u>unavailable</u> to God's power because God resists the proud, but He gives grace to the humble (James 4:6).
