What would be your life's mission statement?							

- Most successful organizations have a clear <u>mission</u> statement that defines who they are, and what they are called to do which ultimately becomes their guiding <u>principle</u>.
- No matter how new or old the organization is, a <u>mission</u> statement is key in providing direction. In the same way, no matter how new or old you are in the faith, you need a mission statement that is Christ-centered and that <u>represents</u> who you are and who you are becoming in Christ.
- When you have a correct <u>mission</u> statement it will assist you in knowing the <u>right</u> tasks to take on as well as knowing which tasks to leave alone.
- Our lives of prayer not only <u>reveal</u> what we're supposed to do, but also how we're supposed to do it.
- Your mission statement will align you with God's will for your life and it will direct you to the right people who will help you to be fruitful in achieving what God has planned for you.
- Prayer will <u>reveal</u> to you suitable mentors and co-laborers, the proper track of preparation and opportunities that God has ordained.

- During battle it is understood that in order to <u>coordinate</u> efforts with other troops, it is necessary to talk to one another <u>consistently</u> about plans of action and not with idle chatter.
- Our spiritual life is also a <u>battle</u> and our communication lines with the Father need to be wide open and not full of idle chatter either. This allows us to receive God's plan of action for our lives.
- In this passage, God has just told Hezekiah, through the prophet Isaiah, to set his house in order because he would not recover from the sickness that caused him great suffering. Hezekiah's response was to turn his face to the wall and pray to God.
- Hezekiah's decision to pray <u>directly</u> to God had such a meaningful impact on God that God decided to change His mind and give Hezekiah fifteen more years.
- If you intentionally use prayer as the tool of communication that God has designed it to be what (within God's will) would be possible that you previously thought was impossible?

- In our Scripture, Jesus tells the women who meet Him at the tomb to go tell the disciples and Peter to meet him in <u>Galilee</u>.
